Worship: We believe that it is important for every person to faithfully participate in corporate worship.

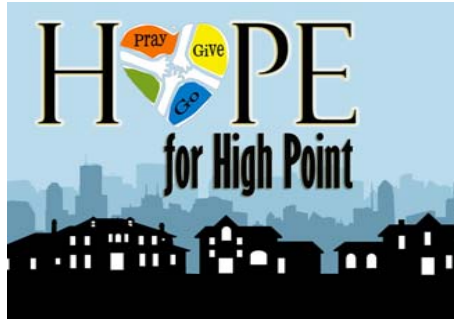
Connect: We believe that every person needs to connect with other Christians in small group Bible study.

We believe that the parents have the primary responsibility for the spiritual nurturing of their children and that it is the responsibility of the church to assist them in this task. Connection Classes are where we begin our task by laying a solid foundation for preschoolers to learn the basics of our faith.

Connection Classes are the primary Bible teaching tool that we use to help our preschoolers learn essential facts in each of our subject areas, such as: God loves me and cares for me; Jesus grew and had a family; and the stories in the Bible are real. We use a combination of Bible learning centers and a group time to convey our message each week.

Connection Classes meet weekly at 9:45 on Sunday mornings year round. Teaching/volunteer positions require a criminal background check.

EXTENDED TEACHING CARE

During both our Blend and Bold worship services on Sunday mornings, we begin or continue the Bible study that is taught in our Connection Classes through *Extended Teaching Care*. While the same Bible story and Bible verses are taught during this time, the activities are unique so that meaningful learning will be achieved for both the child who is here both hours and those that arrive for one session only.

ETC classes meet every Sunday at 8:30 and 11:00 am year round. Volunteers in this ministry may choose to work once a month, twice a month, or every week. *ETC* positions require a criminal background check.

M & M (Music & Missions Education programs)

During the missions portion, preschoolers learn about people and countries around the world and about the work of Southern Baptist missionaries in these places. They also learn about groups within the United States that missionaries serve among such as homeless, migrant workers, ethnic groups, and international students.

During the music portion, preschoolers learn songs that teach spiritual truths and the joy of worship. A couple of times a year, they get the opportunity to lead in worship through special performances. Both mission and music promote active involvement in missions and mission projects.

M & M meets Wednesdays, 6:30–7:30 year round. Volunteers in this program can choose to work in the missions portion, the music portion, or both. There are also single week commitments during the summer months available. These positions require a criminal background check.

Throughout the year there are a variety of special events planned for preschoolers and their families. These events are advertised in *The Reminder*, the worship folder, and on the website.

The largest of these events is our annual **Vacation Bible School**. In VBS, preschoolers often learn and experience different cultures or environments while learning about God's plan for their lives.

Volunteers for special events are recruited for each event. Generally, opportunities for service in special events are listed in church publications with contact information provided.

UpStreet is our Sunday morning environment for elementary-aged kids (1–5 grade). On UpStreet, we believe the Bible should never be boring and that worship can be geared for kids, and good leaders will always care.

UPSTREET GUEST SERVICES TEAM

Make first time guests feel and know, they are already a valued part of UpStreet. Be able to answer guest's questions. Be warm and welcoming. Personally escort them to UpStreet and give them a guest information bag

UPSTREET PRAISE TEAM (Adult)

Perform the praise song to its fullest potential; Attend weekly practice; Know the lyrics to all the songs; Know my part; Engage the kids from the platform.

UPSTREET PRODUCTION TEAM (Audio & Video)

Tell the story as effectively as possible with the use of sounds, lights, and cameras without distracting the audience. Be trained on the equipment. Hit cues as assigned on the weekly cue sheet. Come prepared for the service. Help communicate the message being shared from the platform.

UPSTREET BIG TIME TALK PRESENTER AND COMIC HOST

Clearly and comically, introduce the virtue, the bottom line of the lesson, and challenge families to apply the truths at home. To connect the Bible story with the bottom line in an effective way that it becomes practical for the kids and families. Present God's Word in a relevant and true manner. Be prepared in advance with the materials provided. Work with the comic host to engage the kids and introduce the virtue and the day's topic in a comedic way that has kids and parents wanting to know more. Connect with the kids through skits and games. Connect with kids after UpStreet.

UPSTREET SMALL GROUP LEADER

Connects relationally with 8-10 children to speak truth into their lives and celebrate spiritual growth. Review and be prepared to teach from the Talk Sheet to the kids each week. Follow up with the kids throughout the week. Build healthy relationships with the kids.

QUEST (Wednesday Evenings)

This is a year-long commitment to our students as you lead them to understand what it means to love God, His word, His people, and our world. Your involvement includes not only Sunday mornings during the Connection Class hour, but Wednesday nights during our high school worship service as well. There are two main ways to more specifically describe what a leader's involvement looks like:

1. To engage the students in your grade level through consistent and regular relational involvement (via in person, phone call, text message, and/or email), doing group activities together, praying for them daily, and following up with visitors.
2. To teach a lesson and facilitate discussion questions on Sundays alongside at least one other leader.

There will also be occasional times to facilitate discussion questions on Wednesday nights as well. Also, our leaders are expected to attend leader meetings when they occur (every other month for about an hour). Lastly, leader positions require a criminal background check.
