INTERNATIONAL MISSIONS

In addition to serving locally, GSBC is committed to taking the Gospel throughout the world and sharing God's love through various service projects. There are several church families and individuals living and serving in various locations around the world. Short-term mission opportunities allow us to go and serve.

Chiang Mai, Thailand: February 15--25, 2012. Partner with C & R in Thailand by working with local children & outreach to women in the Red Light District. Approximate Cost: \$2400 (depending on airfare)

Haiti Mission Trip: March 18--24, 2012. Medical Mission Trip supporting Baptist State Convention in weekly clinics in Port-au-Prince, Haiti. Cost: \$1100

Swansea, Wales: May 11--19, 2012. Partner with Mt. Pleasant Baptist Church in Swansea, Wales ministering to the lost in the community. The team will also be working with Iranian refugees in Swansea. Team Size: 25 Approximate Cost: \$1200

Managua, Nicaragua: June 16--June 23, 2012. Choir & Orchestra to minister to churches in Managua and local community. Conduct times of worship, outreach, VBS, sports evangelism, music teaching & medical missions. Approximate Cost: \$1500

Nairobi, Kenya: November 7--17, 2012. Team will work with local churches in the slums of Kenya doing construction, children's ministry, prayer walking & evangelism events. Team Size: 16 Cost: \$2800

Taichung, Taiwan: December 13--23, 2012. Mission Team will be doing Christmas Outreach in the local schools in Taipei. Team Size: 12 Cost: \$2400
